Media monitoring analysis

January 2024





Executive Summary

- The number of articles about Ukraine in major international online media in January 2024 decreased by 3% compared to December 2023, and social media buzz decreased by 21%.
- There were 16K+ articles about Ukraine in major international online media with total reach of 301 mln contacts.
- The largest daily number of articles about Ukraine in January was published on the day **of the 50th prisoner of war exchange**. Other events that caused an increase in media attention to Ukraine included:
 - IL-76 crash in Belgorod region, Russia
 - Russian shelling of Kharkiv, Odesa, and Kyiv
 - World Economic Forum in Dayos
 - The Pentagon releasing a report on the improper tracking of military aid to Ukraine
- The largest Ukraine-related topics in terms of the **share of voice** were:
 - ► International support 18% of articles
 - ► Russian shelling of Ukrainian cities 10% of articles
 - ► IL-76 crash in Belgorod region, Russia 6% of articles
 - ► Sanctions against Russia and seizure of Russian assets abroad 4% of articles
 - ► World Economic Forum in Davos 4% of articles
 - Prisoner of war exchange 4% of articles




Methodology

- To create this report, we analysed **articles about Ukraine** published in the **biggest international online news media** and **mentions posted on social media** during January 2024.
- The list of the top news media was defined **based on the audience size** of the source.
- The report covers **65 major news media sources** for the following languages:
 - English (30 sources)
 - German (16 sources)
 - French (12 sources)
 - Spanish (7 sources)

The list of the analysed media sources can be found on the <u>last page</u> of this report.


- The list of the analysed social media sources include **Twitter**, **Facebook**, **Instagram**, **YouTube**, **and Reddit**.


Share of English, German, French, and Spanish articles among original publications about Ukraine in major online news media







Number of articles citing Ukrainian or Russian public figures








Share of articles citing Ukrainian or Russian public figures, different languages



Share of articles citing Ukrainian or Russian public figures, all languages




MAIN NARRATIVES OF THE KEY TOPICS



International support for Ukraine

- For the fifth consecutive month, the future of US support for Ukraine has been the most discussed topic in foreign media. The aid to Kyiv is being stalled in Congress by the Republican Party, which is demanding stronger security measures at the southern border with Mexico and significant changes to the US asylum system before proceeding.
 - The position of the Republicans, according to Western media, is influenced in part by presidential candidate Donald Trump. He is known for praising the Russian president and has been reluctant to offer active support to Ukraine.
 - Publications criticizing the refusal to support Ukraine label it as a foreign policy blunder and a sign of weakness,
 highlighting potential geopolitical repercussions.
 - The issue of support for Ukraine has become an object of internal American debate due to deep political divisions within the United States.
- Western media also reported on military assistance to Ukraine from Germany, France, and Japan.
- Hungary's blocking of €50 billion from the EU also received wide media coverage.


MAIN NARRATIVES OF THE KEY TOPICS



Russia's shelling of Ukrainian cities

- In January, international media extensively reported on a surge in Russian drone and missile attacks on Ukrainian cities. The media focused on particularly large-scale airstrikes launched on January 8th, 10th, 13th, 17th, and 23rd, which heavily bombarded Kharkiv, Odesa, Kherson, and Kyiv. Key media reports on this topic:
 - These attacks appeared to align with Moscow's strategy of overwhelming and ultimately destroying Ukraine's air defenses by launching waves of diverse aircraft from multiple locations simultaneously.
 - The attacks also aimed to cripple Ukraine's industrial and military capabilities, while simultaneously eroding Ukrainian morale through a protracted war.
 - Due to a lack of sufficient air defense systems, Ukraine faces the challenge of allocating resources between the active front line and cities further away. Notably, Ukraine lacks enough surface-to-air missiles capable of intercepting Russian missiles.
 - According to the UN, these intensive airstrikes have led to a significant increase in civilian casualties.
 - Media reports expressed growing concern among Ukrainians about the potential depletion of their air defense ammunition, further complicated by the uncertain status of additional military aid from the United States.

IL-76 crash in the Belgorod region, Russia

■ The Western media actively disseminated Russia's claims that Ukraine had shot down a plane carrying Ukrainian prisoners of war for exchange. In their publications, the media noted that Ukrainian officials had not commented on the crash for a long time.

Key media reports on this topic:

- Confirming that prisoners of war were on board would significantly impact Ukraine, exacerbating the demoralisation among Ukrainians. This demoralisation is already severe, due to concerns over Western support, a failed counter-offensive, and issues with mobilisation.
- The doubts regarding the authenticity of Russian claims, alongside discrepancies between these claims and available evidence, suggest that Moscow might be distorting events and employing disinformation to pursue its political objectives. Russia's alleged disinformation about the downing of the plane is a clear example of the strategic planning of an information campaign aimed at discrediting the Ukrainian army and destabilising the population.

- According to data from the Determ social media listening tool, mentions of Ukraine on social media saw a **21% decrease** from December 2023 to January 2024.
- Similar to news media, **the future of U.S. aid to Ukraine** was the most widely discussed topic on social media in January.
