Media monitoring analysis

February 2024





Executive Summary

- The number of articles about Ukraine in major international online media in February increased by 43% compared to January, and social media discussions increased by 48%.
- There were 23K+ articles about Ukraine in major international online media with total reach of 377 mln contacts.
- The largest daily number of articles about Ukraine in February was published on **February 23**, the day before the second anniversary of Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine. Other events that caused an increase in media attention to Ukraine included:
 - Dismissal of Valerii Zaluzhnyi, the Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces of Ukraine
 - Death of Russian opposition leader Alexei Navalny
 - 17-year-old Ukrainian player Volodymyr Yermakov killed in Germany
 - Paris-based conference for European leaders aimed at strengthening Western support for Ukraine
- The largest Ukraine-related topics in terms of the **share of voice** were:
 - ► International support 28% of articles
 - ► The second anniversary of Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine 6% of articles
 - Russian offensive and battle for Avdiivka— 5% of articles
 - Sanctions against Russia and seizure of Russian assets abroad 5% of articles
 - ► Changes at the command of Armed Forces of Ukraine 4% of articles
 - ► Western weapons for Ukraine 3% of articles




Methodology

- To create this report, we analysed **articles about Ukraine** published in the **biggest international online news media** and **mentions posted on social media** during February.
- The list of the top news media was defined **based on the audience size** of the source.
- The report covers **65 major news media sources** for the following languages:
 - English (30 sources)
 - German (16 sources)
 - French (12 sources)
 - Spanish (7 sources)

The list of the analysed media sources can be found on the last page of this report.


- The list of the analysed social media sources include **Twitter**, **Facebook**, **Instagram**, **YouTube**, **and Reddit**.







Number of articles citing Ukrainian or Russian public figures







Share of articles citing Ukrainian or Russian public figures, all languages




MAIN NARRATIVES OF THE KEY TOPICS



International support for Ukraine

- For the sixth consecutive month, the future of US support for Ukraine has been the most discussed topic in foreign media. The uncertainty surrounding funding for arms supplies to Ukraine persists, primarily due to the stance taken by Republicans in the US Congress. Meanwhile, the White House and Democrats are urging the passage of a new aid package as soon as possible. Coverage of this topic included the following popular messages:
 - Former US President Donald Trump advocates for providing aid to Ukraine solely in the form of loans and has criticized NATO. This stance has influenced Republican sentiment, raising concerns regarding the bill's alignment with national interests and financial security;
 - The delay in aid has resulted in a shortage of ammunition and other essential resources for the Ukrainian army, leading to territorial losses and human casualties;
 - Western media have highlighted the potential for Putin's aggression to extend to other countries, such as the Baltic States or
 Poland. In February, this perspective gained considerable traction in the media. Additionally, reports suggest that delays in aid could undermine the US and NATO's position on the global stage.
- The media has placed significant emphasis on security cooperation agreements between Ukraine and countries such as Germany, France, Denmark, Canada, and Italy. Additionally, Western media sources have covered military assistance to Ukraine from various nations and highlighted public support for Ukraine from leaders of allied countries, including the Estonian Prime Minister, Kaja Kallas.
- Active discussions in the media were sparked by a statement made by French President Emmanuel Macron at an international meeting in Paris, where he mentioned that he did not rule out the possibility of sending troops to Ukraine. This remark from the French leader drew criticism from some NATO and EU partners. Additionally, the media widely disseminated Russian President Vladimir Putin's reaction to Macron's statement.


MAIN NARRATIVES OF THE KEY TOPICS



The second anniversary of Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine

- The coverage surrounding the anniversary was varied in terms of topics. Reports highlighted global mass actions in support of Ukraine, photo exhibitions dedicated to the war, articles exploring the history of the Ukrainian military and refugees, and analysis on the war's impact on mental health.
- The media prominently featured Volodymyr Zelenskyy's role as a military leader, while also highlighting the signs of President's disagreements with figures such as Valerii Zaluzhnyi, Vitalii Klitschko, and various media representatives. Special attention was paid to the support from Western leaders. Additionally, publications included maps detailing the front lines and active fighting zones, as well as summaries regarding Russian artillery attacks on Ukrainian territories.
- Coverage of this topic included the following popular messages:
 - The second anniversary of Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine was characterized by the prolonged nature of the war, a stalemate at the frontline with no significant changes, and increasing uncertainty regarding the war's future development;
 - Ukraine's success in the war depends on military assistance from the West, and its absence or delay leads to more casualties and prolongation of the war;
 - The second anniversary of the invasion outlines an alarming outlook for European security. Due to the growing geopolitical threats posed by Russia, the media point to the importance of rearming Europe;
 - The media highlighted the resilience of Ukrainians, their willingness to fight for their freedom, and the transformation of Ukrainian nationalism and identity based on confrontation with Russia. The media emphasised the resilience of the Ukrainian spirit, stressing that Russian aggression began in 2014 with the occupation of Crimea. Some publications were dedicated to the lives of Ukrainians during the war, stating that fatigue is a luxury Ukrainians cannot afford.



Russian offensive and fighting in Avdiivka

- Covering the retreat of Ukrainian troops from Avdiivka, the Western media focused on the following theses:
 - Russia's success in Avdiivka is a result of the Ukrainian armed forces' lack of weapons due to the delay in aid from allies;
 - The capture of Avdiivka is Russia's biggest achievement since Bakhmut.
- The articles presented diverse viewpoints on the implications of the situation, from opinions that the capture of Avdiivka was merely symbolic, to worries that it signified a pathway for further Russian advancement. However, the predominant sentiment among these was a negative assessment of the consequences.
- Foreign media reported that Avdiivka represented the first significant challenge for Oleksandr Syrskyi as the new Commander-in-Chief of the Ukrainian Armed Forces. The coverage compared the military leadership's decisions in Avdiivka with those made in a similar situation in Bakhmut. While the prolonged defense of Avdiivka inflicted heavy casualties on the Russian army, the Ukrainian military leadership, acknowledging the enemy's significant superiority, opted to prioritize saving lives.




