Media monitoring analysis

March 2024



Executive Summary

- **The number of articles about Ukraine** in major international online media in March **decreased by 4%** compared to February, and social media discussions decreased by **17%**.
- There were **22K+ articles** about Ukraine in major international online media with **total reach of 284 mln contacts**.
- The largest daily number of articles about Ukraine in February was published on **days when Russia fired missiles attacks on Ukrainian cities and energy infrastructure**. Other events that caused an increase in media attention to Ukraine included:
 - The presidential election in Russia
 - The film "20 Days in Mariupol" won an Oscar
 - Terrorist attack in Crocus City Hall in Moscow
 - The International Criminal Court issued an arrest warrant for two Russian commanders
 - Shelling of the Russian city of Belgorod
- The largest Ukraine-related topics in terms of the **share of voice** were:
 - ▶ International support — 13% of articles
 - ▶ Russian shelling of Ukrainian cities — 8% of articles
 - ▶ Terrorist attack in Crocus City Hall in Moscow — 7% of articles
 - ▶ Leaked recording of German officers discussing military aid to Ukraine — 4% of articles
 - ▶ Sanctions against Russia and seizure of Russian assets abroad — 3% of articles
 - ▶ Discussions about the deployment of NATO troops to Ukraine — 3% of articles

Methodology

- To create this report, we analysed **articles about Ukraine** published in the **biggest international online news media** and **mentions posted on social media** during March.
- The list of the top news media was defined **based on the audience size** of the source.
- The report covers **65 major news media sources** for the following languages:
 - English (30 sources)
 - German (16 sources)
 - French (12 sources)
 - Spanish (7 sources)


- The list of the analysed social media sources include **Twitter, Facebook, Instagram, YouTube, and Reddit**.

Share of English, German, French, and Spanish articles among original publications about Ukraine in major online news media







Number of articles citing Ukrainian or Russian public figures







International support for Ukraine

- This topic includes articles related to the supplying of various types of military, economic and humanitarian assistance to Ukraine, as well as other actions to support Ukraine, post-war reconstruction and the search for diplomatic ways to end the war.
- In March, media coverage of international support for Ukraine was mainly focused on:
 - the issue of further support from the United States and its approval by the Congress;
 - growing concerns in Europe about the potential expansion of Russian aggression and the need to increase European assistance to Ukraine;
 - debate on providing Ukraine with German Taurus missiles.
- The fate of new US arms supplies to Ukraine remains uncertain due to the position of the Republicans in the US Congress. The media was dominated by reports stating that providing the necessary assistance to Ukraine was extremely important as the situation in Ukraine deteriorated. Delayed aid leads to Ukrainian casualties and a renewed Russian initiative on the battlefield. Lack of ammunition and restrictions on the use of air defence systems in Ukraine pose serious risks to civilians and exacerbate the humanitarian crisis. A delay by the United States could undermine US credibility and leadership and increase the risk of an escalation of the war in Europe.
- Uncertainty about the US commitment to Ukraine has forced European allies to fill the gap in support for Ukraine. The media noted that European leaders are calling for unity in the face of Russian aggression. This requires strengthening Europe's defence, increasing EU military budgets, and considering a joint debt plan to finance the defence industry. The publications on this topic focused, in particular, on military assistance from the EU, the Czech Republic and Germany. The media also focused on the two-day summit of EU leaders in Brussels, where they discussed ways to radically increase military and financial support for Ukraine, and the meeting of the Contact Group on Ukraine's Defence, headed by US Secretary of Defence Lloyd Austin (Ramstein format);
- German media actively discussed the issue of providing long-range missiles to Ukraine. The German parliament, the Bundestag, again failed to support the delivery of Taurus missiles. During the debate, Olaf Scholz reiterated the thesis that the supply of missiles, which involves the deployment of German soldiers on the territory of Ukraine, is a line he does not want to cross.

Russian shelling of Ukrainian cities

- The media focused on the intense Russian shelling of Kyiv, Kharkiv and Odesa, as well as a large-scale attack on Ukraine's energy infrastructure. The media reported that Russia was taking advantage of Ukraine's moment of weakness, while the United States is delaying aid to Ukraine. Another common media thesis was that the shelling of Ukraine was the Kremlin's revenge for Ukrainian shelling of Russian-bordered areas, particularly Belgorod.
- On 6 March, during the visit of Volodymyr Zelenskyy and Greek Prime Minister Kyriakos Mitsotakis to Odesa, Russia launched a missile attack on the city's port infrastructure. The shelling killed five people. Media reports noted that Ukraine's Western allies condemned the attack as a cowardly tactic by Russia and an attempt at terrorism;
- On the morning of 21 March, Russian troops fired 31 missiles on Kyiv. The media reported that Russia repeated the strategy of late December last year, aimed at depleting Ukraine's air defences through multiple launches of various types of missiles, including ballistic and hypersonic missiles. On 22 March, Russia again carried out a massive missile and drone strike on energy infrastructure, which led to power outages in at least seven regions of Ukraine. In particular, Ukraine's largest hydroelectric power station, the DniproHES in Zaporizhzhia, was hit. The publications drew parallels with the blackouts of 2022 and noted that the Russian shelling had left more than a million Ukrainians without power and was one of the largest attacks on Ukraine's energy infrastructure during the war.
- The publications noted Volodymyr Zelenskyy's appeal to Western countries. The President of Ukraine called for the political will to provide Ukraine with more military assistance, especially air defence systems, stressing the need for global unity in the fight against terror.
- The media also reported that Ukraine's air defence forces had shot down more than 2,000 Russian cruise missiles since the start of Russia's full-scale invasion.

Terrorist attack in Crocus City Hall in Moscow

- On 22 March, a terrorist attack took place at the Crocus City Hall concert hall near Moscow. According to the Russian Ministry of Health, more than 140 people were injured. The Islamic State terrorist group claimed responsibility for the attack. Putin stated that the detained suspects were trying to flee to Ukraine, and Russian media launched a large-scale propaganda campaign aimed at discrediting Ukraine. Western media reports on this topic were dominated by the message that Putin, although having eventually admitted that the attack was carried out by radical Islamists, continued to accuse Ukraine of involvement in the attack in order to justify another escalation of the war. The media stressed that there was no evidence to support Putin's accusations.
- The media reported that Ukraine categorically denies any involvement in the terrorist attack. In particular, Volodymyr Zelenskyy said that Ukraine never uses terrorist methods of warfare, and Ukrainian intelligence claims that the attack was planned by Russian special services.
- The media also noted that world leaders condemned the attack but did not believe Russia's accusations against Ukraine. In addition, the United States had previously warned Russia of a possible terrorist attack. Western countries called for an independent investigation.
- Among other messages on this topic in media:
 - Putin's public acknowledgement of Islamic militants' responsibility for the attack could weaken the Kremlin's calls for Russians to unite around the war against Ukraine;
 - Russia's short-sighted obsession with the war with Ukraine has led to a decline in internal security in Russia, and the terrorist attack casts doubt on the strength of Putin's control over Russia.

- Data from the Determ social media listening tool shows that the amount of mentions of Ukraine on social media decreased by 17% from February to March.
- Similar to news media, **the future of U.S. aid to Ukraine** was the most widely discussed topic on social media in March.
- **Other trending topics included**
 - Discussions about the topic of deploying NATO troops to Ukraine
 - Sanctions against Russia and the seizure of Russian assets abroad
 - Reaction to Pope Francis' statement on the courage to raise the "white flag" for Ukraine
 - European support for Ukraine: meeting of the Weimar Triangle leaders in Berlin and the allocation of 5 billion euros by the EU
 - Threat to Europe's security
 - Losses of the Russian army in Ukraine
 - The threat of Russia's use of nuclear weapons
