Media monitoring analysis

June 2024



Executive Summary

- In June, the number of articles about Ukraine in major international online media increased by 12% compared to May, and mentions on social networks increased by 7%.
- There were **18K+ articles** about Ukraine in major international online media with **total reach of 242 mln contacts**.
- The highest daily count of articles about Ukraine in June occurred on June 13, the day of the G7 Summit in Italy. During the summit, President Volodymyr Zelenskyy signed bilateral security agreements between Ukraine and the USA, and between Ukraine and Japan. Other significant events that drew increased media attention to Ukraine included:
 - Volodymyr Zelenskyy's visit to Normandy for the 80th anniversary of the Allied landings
 - Joe Biden apologises to Zelenskyy for delay in US military support
 - The Ukrainian national football team's debut at Euro-2024
 - The European Union has opened negotiations on Ukraine's accession
- The largest Ukraine-related topics in terms of the **share of voice** were:
 - International support and Western weapons for Ukraine 14%
 - ▶ Global Peace Summit in Switzerland 5%
 - The use of Western weapons to hit targets in the Russian Federation 5%
 - Ukraine at Euro 2024 5%
 - ▶ Ukraine's topic at the G7 Summit 4%
 - Signing of the strategic partnership agreement between Russia and North Korea 4%
 - Anti-Russian sanctions and confiscated Russian assets 4%

Methodology

- To create this report, we analysed articles about Ukraine published in the biggest international online news media and mentions posted on social media during June.
- The list of the top news media was defined **based on the audience size** of the source.
- The report covers **65 major news media sources** for the following languages:
 - English (30 sources)
 - German (16 sources)
 - French (12 sources)
 - Spanish (7 sources)


- The list of the analysed social media sources include Twitter, Facebook, Instagram, YouTube, and Reddit.

Share of English, German, French, and Spanish articles among original publications about Ukraine in major online news media









MAIN NARRATIVES OF THE KEY TOPICS

BRAND UKRAINE

International support and Western weapons for Ukraine

This topic includes articles related to the providing of various types of military, economic and humanitarian assistance to Ukraine, as well as other actions to support Ukraine, post-war reconstruction and the search for diplomatic ways to end the war.

During June, Western media focused on several key issues regarding Ukraine: the support of Ukraine by Western leaders, the supply of military aid, Ukraine's participation in the ceremony marking the 80th anniversary of the Allied landings in Normandy, as well as meetings between the President of Ukraine and other world leaders, and agreements signed by Volodymyr Zelenskyy on security cooperation. **Volodymyr Zelenskyy visited France**, where the ceremony marking the 80th anniversary of the Allied landings took place. This event commemorated the American, Canadian, and British soldiers who landed in Normandy during World War II.

On June 27, Ukraine and the EU signed a bilateral security agreement during the EU Leaders' Summit in Brussels. Volodymyr Zelenskyy signed an agreement on security cooperation and long-term support between Ukraine and Estonia, as well as an agreement on security cooperation between Ukraine and the Republic of Lithuania.

Among other key events in June highlighted by Western media on the topic of international support for Ukraine:

Western Weapons:

- French President Emmanuel Macron announced the delivery of Mirage 2000-5 fighter jets to Ukraine;
- U.S. President Joe Biden approved the transfer of a Patriot missile system to Ukraine, as well as temporarily halting the export of these systems to other countries;
- Spain delivered a second batch of Patriot missiles and Leopard tanks to Ukraine, as well as 155mm artillery, anti-drone systems, and electro-optical surveillance systems.

Financial Aid:

U.S. Vice President Kamala Harris announced a new aid package for Ukraine worth \$1.5 billion. The funds will primarily be used for the restoration of the country's energy sector.

Other Events:

A meeting between Volodymyr Zelenskyy and Joe Biden in Paris. The U.S. President apologized for the delay in the delivery of weapons to Ukraine;

Hungarian Prime Minister Viktor Orbán stated that Hungary would not obstruct NATO's plan to provide military support to Ukraine;

NATO is establishing a headquarters in Germany to coordinate weapons supplies and training for Ukrainian soldiers.

MAIN NARRATIVES OF THE KEY TOPICS

Global Peace Summit in Switzerland

International media noted that the summit held on June 15-16 in Switzerland was the largest international event in support of Ukraine and peace.

Among the positive reports in the media on this topic:

- 101 countries and international organizations participated in the summit, **highlighting the broad support for Ukraine from the global community;**
- Participants signed a Joint **Communiqué on the foundations of peace** and agreed on a common position regarding three points: food security, nuclear and energy security, and the release of all Ukrainian prisoners and deportees. Before the summit, the media noted that the signing of the communiqué would be seen as a diplomatic success for Ukraine, which is seeking to garner international support.

There were also critical comments regarding the summit:

The media noted the **unfavourable situation on the battlefield for Ukraine to negotiate** and raised doubts about the appropriateness of discussing peace when the objective situation in Ukraine remains challenging and brutal;

The absence of Russia and its key partner China at the summit made significant achievements in the negotiations unlikely, lowering overall expectations for the summit's outcomes;

Countries such as India, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, and the UAE, which have important trade relations with Russia as members of the **BRICS economic group, refused to sign the joint communiqué agreed** upon by over 80 countries and international organizations. Publications highlighted that the refusal of these states to sign the joint communiqué demonstrates the difficulty of achieving unity in the international approach to the peace process in Ukraine.

A notable event for the media was the absence of U.S. President Joe Biden at the summit.

The use of Western weapons to hit targets in the Russian Federation

At the end of May, media outlets covered the easing of Western restrictions on Ukraine's use of weapons to target military

objectives in Russia. This topic remained relevant in June as well. While in May, Western media largely reflected the increase in support for Ukraine from NATO and European allies regarding the use of Western weapons to strike targets on Russian territory and conveyed support for Ukraine in its efforts to defend its territorial integrity and sovereignty, by June, articles began to feature critical remarks regarding such decisions. Authors Samuel Charap and Jeremy Shapiro in <u>The Washington Post</u>, as well as the editorial team of <u>Le Monde</u> in their publications, expressed the opinion that **the decision to use Western weapons to target sites in Russia leads to escalation rather than the cessation of the war.** The authors noted that the lack of a unified strategy among Western allies regarding military support for Ukraine contributes to Russia's initiatives.

Among the events on this topic extensively covered by the media:					
 Ukraine struck a Russian S-300/400 air defence battery in the Belgorod region; 	Putin criticized the West for supplying long-range weapons to Ukraine, warning that Moscow could supply similar weapons to other countries for attacks on Western targets;				
 U.S. Secretary of Defence Lloyd Austin stated that the new policy allowing Ukrainian forces to strike targets inside Russia would be "very, very helpful to Ukrainians in the future"; 	 Russia deployed a nuclear submarine to Havana. The U.S. government views this move as a response to the permission to use American weapons against targets on Russian territory.

 - Reaction to the difference in the international community's attitude towards refugees from Ukraine and Palestine
 - The course of hostilities at the front
 - Missile strikes in the temporarily occupied Crimea by Russia
