

Media monitoring analysis

July 2024





Executive Summary

- In July, **the number of articles about Ukraine** in major international online media **decreased by 12%** compared to July, and mentions on social networks **decreased by 38%**.
- There were 14K+ articles about Ukraine in major international online media with total reach of 198 mln contacts.
- The highest daily count of articles about Ukraine in July occurred on **July 8-10**, **during the NATO Summit Washington 2024**, **and when Russia launched a missile strike on the "Okhmatdyt" children's hospital in Kyiv.** Other significant events that drew increased media attention to Ukraine included:
 - Viktor Orban's visits to Ukraine and Russia
 - Joe Biden's withdrawal from the U.S. presidential race
 - Viktor Orban's statement that Donald Trump is ready to act as a mediator in peace negotiations between Ukraine and Russia if he wins the election
 - Olha Kharlan winning the bronze medal at the 2024 Olympics
 - The Russian offensive in the Donetsk region
- The largest Ukraine-related topics in terms of the **share of voice** were:
 - ► NATO Summit Washington 2024 12%
 - ► International support and Western weapons for Ukraine 10%
 - Viktor Orban's "peace mission" 9%
 - Russian shelling of Ukrainian cities 8%
 - Ukraine's topic in the U.S. election battles 8%
 - ▶ Ukraine at the 2024 Summer Olympics in Paris 6%
 - ► Russian offensive in the Donetsk region 5%




Methodology

- To create this report, we analysed articles about Ukraine published in the biggest international online news media and mentions posted on social media during July.
- The list of the top news media was defined **based on the audience size** of the source.
- The report covers **65 major news media sources** for the following languages:
 - English (30 sources)
 - German (16 sources)
 - French (12 sources)
 - Spanish (7 sources)

The list of the analysed media sources can be found on the last page of this report.

- The list of the analysed social media sources include **Twitter**, **Facebook**, **Instagram**, **YouTube**, **and Reddit**.
- The media database for the analysis was **provided by the Looqme media monitoring company.**
- The social media database was **provided by the Determ monitoring company**.














Share of articles citing Ukrainian or Russian public figures, different languages

MAIN NARRATIVES OF THE KEY TOPICS



NATO Summit Washington 2024

From July 9-11, the 75th anniversary NATO Summit took place in Washington. In addition to the 32 Alliance members, representatives from 35 partner countries, including Ukraine, participated in the event. Western media extensively covered the topic of Russia's war against Ukraine in their summit-related publications.

NATO demonstrates unwavering support for Ukraine and emphasizes the importance of strategic decisions for military aid to Ukraine. Newly appointed British Prime Minister Keir Starmer and U.S. President Joe Biden clearly express their stance on supporting Ukraine, primarily through military assistance and political backing against Russian aggression. Summit participants stress the importance of maintaining unity to effectively counter Russian threats.

NATO promises Ukraine continued support but has not reached a consensus on the timeline for Ukraine's admission to the alliance, which remains a contentious issue due to fears of escalating the war with Russia. The draft joint communiqué from the NATO Summit underscores the alliance's commitment to supporting Ukraine's future membership, though concrete progress on this matter remains uncertain.

The potential victory of Donald Trump in the upcoming U.S. presidential election in November is **raising concerns among European leaders about the future of the alliance and its support for Ukraine.**

According to certain media outlets, the results of the NATO Summit were deemed insufficient to significantly influence the course of the war. Article authors expressed scepticism about NATO's ability and resolve to provide substantial support to Ukraine for achieving victory in the conflict.

Columnist Daniel Depetris, in a <u>CNN</u> publication, noted that **Ukraine is far from NATO membership** and described the idea of granting such status as "a bad deal".

The media covered **Volodymyr Zelenskyy's speech at the Presidential Foundation and the Ronald Reagan Institute.** They highlighted that the Ukrainian President's call for support in confronting Russia was particularly directed at representatives of the Republican Party.

NATO identifies China as a crucial factor in supporting Russia's war against Ukraine. Specifically, it is noted that Chinese companies have expanded the export of technologies used in Russian drones, military aircraft, missiles, and other weapons employed by Russia against Ukraine.

Media reports highlight that **China and Russia have united in a common stance against NATO**, as part of a broader effort by both countries to alter the global order they view as unjust due to U.S. dominance.

MAIN NARRATIVES OF THE KEY TOPICS



International support and Western weapons for Ukraine

This topic includes articles related to the providing of various types of military, economic and humanitarian assistance to Ukraine, as well as other actions to support Ukraine, post-war reconstruction and the search for diplomatic ways to end the war.

Key events in July highlighted by Western media on the topic of international support for Ukraine:

Financial Assistance and Western Weapons:

- The U.S. announced a new \$2.3 billion military aid package for Ukraine. The package will include air defense systems, ammunition for HIMARS, artillery shells, and funding for the procurement of Patriot and NASAMS air defense missiles;
- Spain has delivered a new batch of military aid to Ukraine, including ten refurbished Leopard 2A4 tanks, excavators, and anti-tank missiles. Spain has also announced additional military aid, which will include another Hawk air defense system battery;
- News has emerged that Germany plans to halve its military aid to Ukraine in 2025. Media reports indicate that the German government will cut military aid to address budgetary shortfalls;
- Czechia has stated that the planned supply of shells to Ukraine will not be fulfilled without additional funding. Czechia is calling on donor countries to contribute extra funds to meet the goal of supplying 800,000 shells by the end of the year.

Other Events in July:


- Western partners supporting Ukraine are actively urging China to use its influence over Russia to seek a diplomatic resolution to the war. Finnish President Alexander Stubb stated that China plays a crucial role in ending the war in Ukraine due to its influence over Russia and called on Beijing to leverage this influence for a diplomatic resolution;
- NATO Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg announced on July 17 the appointment of Patrick Turner as the senior representative of the North Atlantic Alliance's mission in Ukraine;
- German Chancellor Olaf Scholz, in a speech marking the 80th anniversary of the failed assassination attempt on Adolf Hitler, described supporting Ukraine as a matter of Germany's historical responsibility.

The news of the arrival of the first F-16 fighters in Ukraine generated significant excitement in Western media

Reports highlighted that this event is crucial for strengthening the Ukrainian Air Force, which has until now relied on outdated Soviet-era aircraft. The publications noted that the fighters could strike deep into temporarily Russian-occupied territories, defend against Russian cruise missiles, and boost Ukrainian morale.

However, media also reported that Ukraine faces serious challenges with the anticipated delivery of F-16s this summer. These challenges include: Russian strikes on airbases and the need to prepare runways, which create additional difficulties for deploying the fighters; the current limited number of pilots trained on the F-16s, complicating their effective use; at this stage of the war, the F-16s are expected to focus primarily on defending against Russian attacks rather than targeting objectives within Russia, which significantly limits their potential to provide a substantial advantage for Ukraine.

The visits of Hungarian Prime Minister Viktor Orban to Kyiv, Moscow, Beijing, and his meeting with Donald Trump in Florida generated significant international media attention. Key messages regarding these visits include:

- Orban's first visit to Ukraine since the full-scale Russian invasion involved urging President Volodymyr Zelenskyy to consider a "ceasefire" to "accelerate peace negotiations" with Moscow. Orban is attempting to position himself as a peacemaker in Europe while using peace rhetoric to advance Russian interests. His calls for a ceasefire are seen as attempts to strengthen Russia's control over temporarily occupied Ukrainian territories. Media outlets highlighted that Orban's use of the term "peace" is perceived as a euphemism for Ukraine's capitulation to Russia.
- As Russia's closest ally in the EU, **Orban's visits demonstrate his efforts to balance internal and external political interests.** During a meeting with Putin, Orban and the Russian leader emphasized Hungary's official role as the president of the EU Council, raising concerns among other EU members. The three-hour closed-door meeting focused on discussing the "shortest path to peace," which, from the Kremlin's perspective, means Ukraine capitulating to Russia's demands.
- The meeting with Donald Trump is viewed as **an attempt to secure Trump's support**, which could influence the war's course if he wins the upcoming election. In a letter to EU Council leaders, Orban claimed that Trump had formulated "detailed and well-reasoned" plans for achieving peace between Russia and Ukraine. Orban urged EU leaders to explore "windows of opportunity" for creating conditions for "easing tensions," "temporary ceasefire," and "starting peace negotiations".
- Orban's visits sparked outrage among EU leaders, leading to a crisis of trust towards Hungary. **EU leaders and Ukrainian officials condemned Orban's actions by undermining the unified European stance.** European ambassadors criticized Orban's actions, expressing concerns about reputational damage to the EU from his unilateral moves. Publications characterized Orban's meetings as unlawful and accused the Hungarian Prime Minister of acting against EU and NATO unity and interests. European Council President Charles Michel criticized Orban's proposals, reiterating the EU's commitment to support Ukraine as long as necessary and as intensively as required. Legislators deemed Orban's meetings particularly harmful and accused him of "abusing" his position as EU Council president.


