

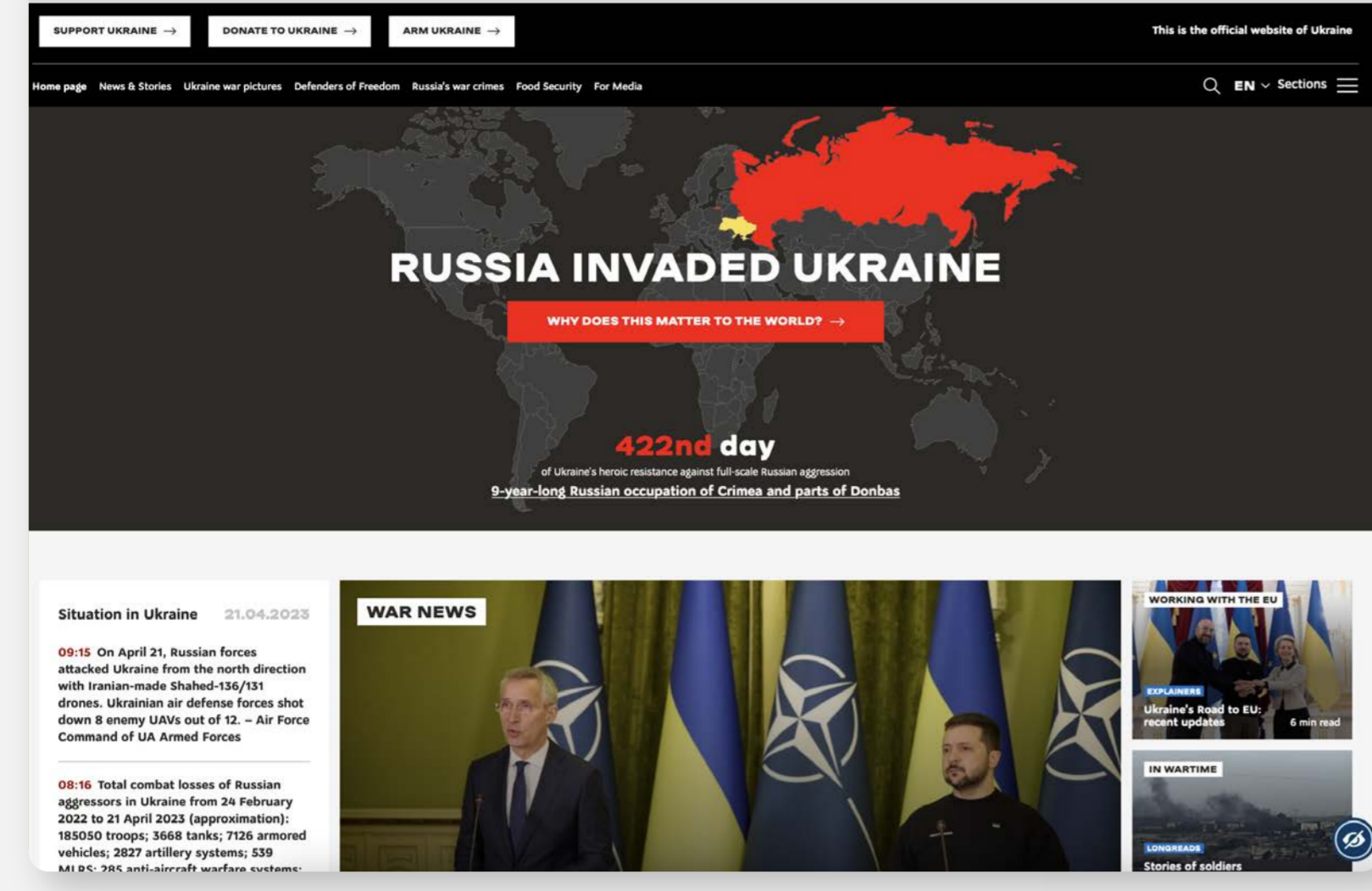
Dear readers,

just over a year ago, our team launched the **war.ukraine.ua** website to share verified and up-to-date information amidst Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine. Since then, the platform has grown quite a lot: we were able to tell several hundred stories of brave Ukrainians, document hundreds of Russia's war crimes, and create dozens of explainers that may help readers get a deeper understanding of Ukraine's past, present, and future. With eight language versions available, the website has reached people in over 190 countries worldwide.

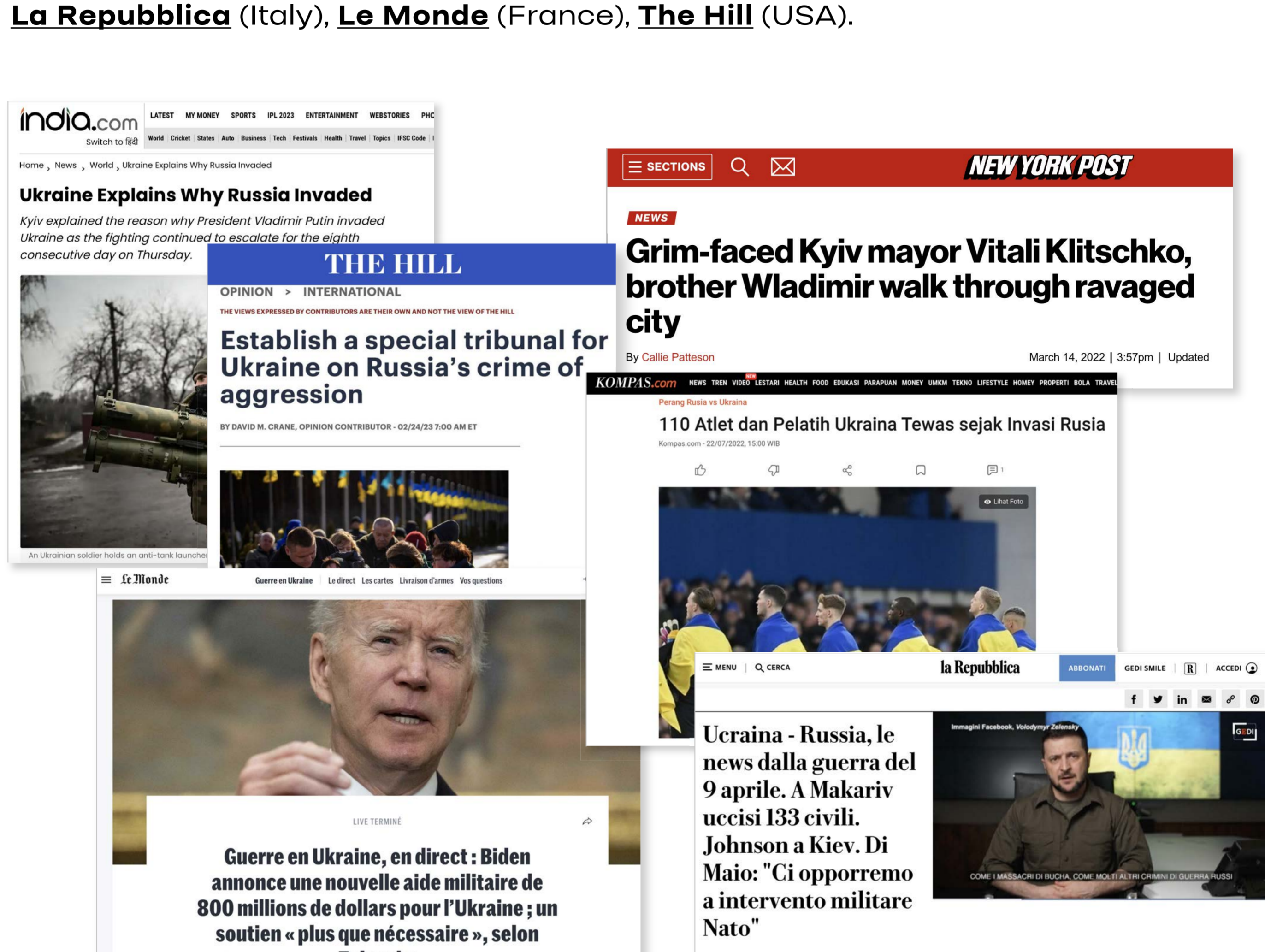

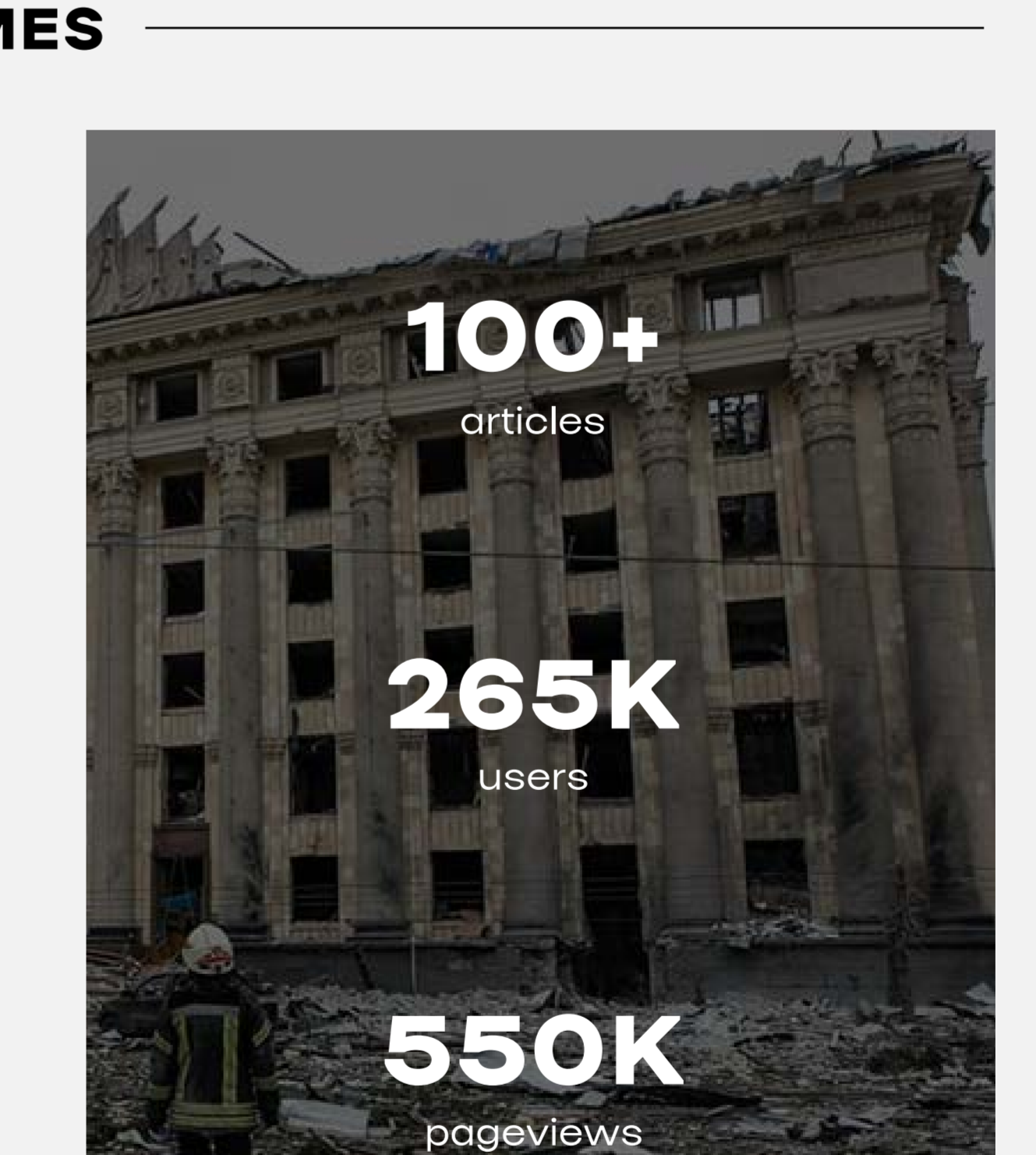


## ARCHIVE OF RUSSIA'S WAR CRIMES

The archive was launched to **gather evidence of the atrocities committed by the Russian army in Ukraine, and ensure that Russian war criminals will not escape justice for them.**

This section on the website includes statistics that are constantly updated with the information from Ukrainian authorities and international organizations, and publications about **recorded war crimes in 7 categories.**

This section of the website was also often used by media outlets worldwide as a source of **verified statistics on war crimes and the number of children killed** by Russia's invasion. Namely, in publications of the Hill (USA), Los Angeles Times (USA), TV 2 (Norway), Yle (Finland), StirilePROTV (Romania), ČT24 (Czech Republic), and TV3 Zinas (Latvia).

The detailed timeline of events from 2014, when Russia first invaded Ukraine, helps to learn (or recall) a wide picture through dates and facts.



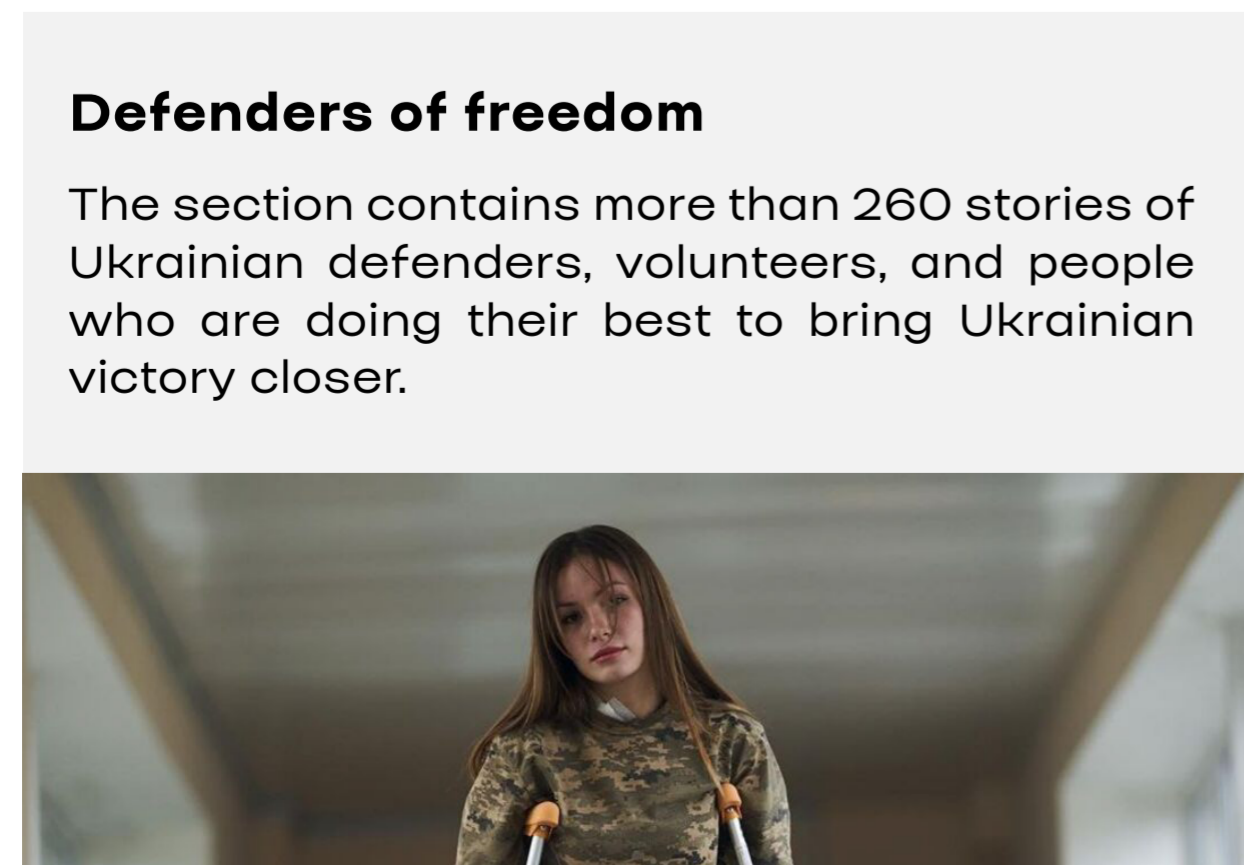
### Russia's famine games

The project puts focus on food security, and the devastating consequences that Russia's invasion has not just in Ukraine but for millions worldwide.



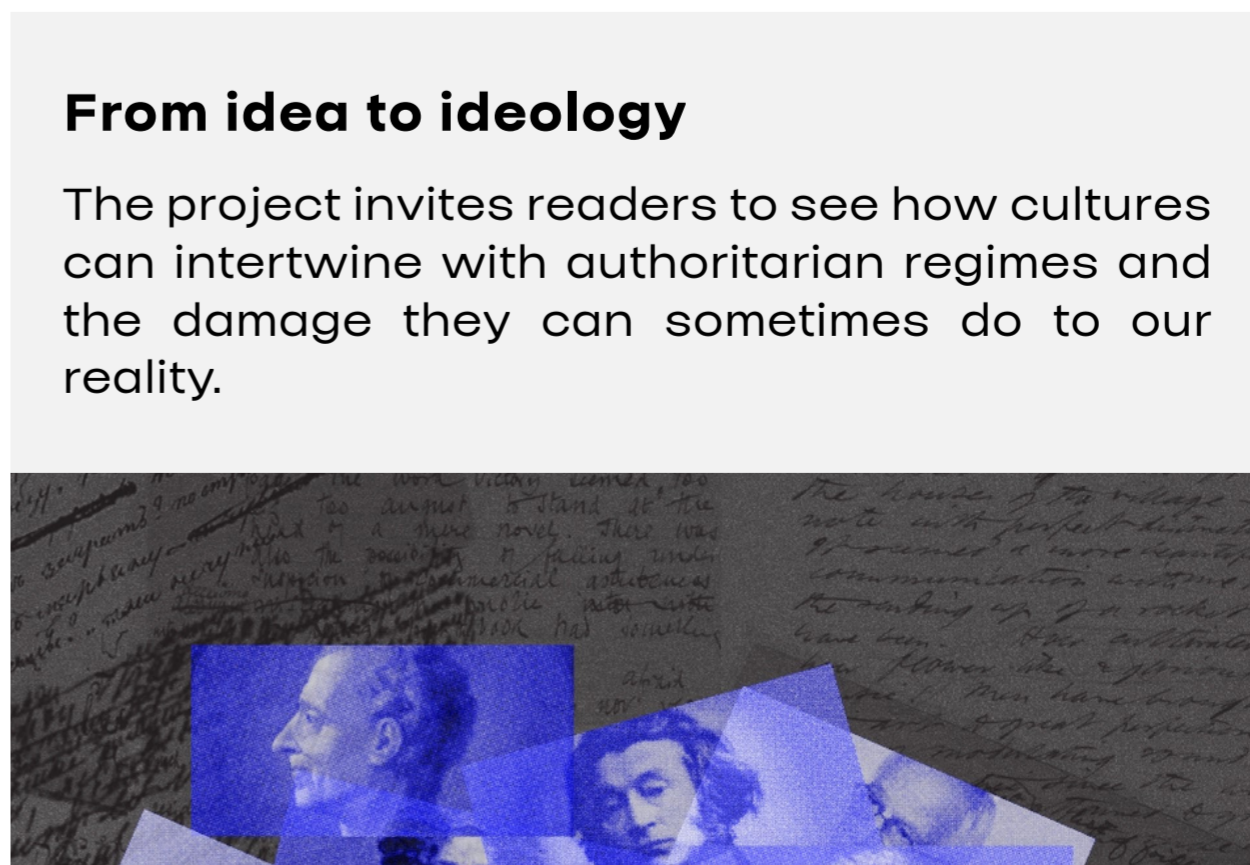
### Defenders of freedom
